Conversation Starters

Why are so many school districts, including ours, going to referendum?

It's a growing trend across Wisconsin and a statewide issue. By the end of 2024, two-thirds of the nine public school districts in Rock County will have gone to referendum, with one district having gone twice. Across the state, 241 referendum questions have been presented in 2024.

What happened to state funding for our schools?

The school funding model from the 1990s promised that the state would cover 66% of local education costs, but today, that contribution is down to about 53%, leaving Wisconsin's per-pupil spending to drop significantly—from 11th in the nation in 2002 to 25th in 2020.

What are the Janesville referendums about?

Janesville voters are being asked to support two referendums: a two-year, \$14.5 million non-recurring operational referendum to replace the measure voters approved in 2020, which is set to expire soon, and a \$151.8 million capital referendum to move forward with Phase 1 of its long-range facilities plan.

How much will it cost me?

The operational referendum has **no** new tax impact—voters will continue paying what they've been paying. The tax impact of the capital referendum will be \$81 for every \$100,000 of property value. So, owning a \$300,000 home would mean an additional \$243 per year, or about \$20.25 per month, starting in the 2025-2026 school year.

What happens if the operational referendum doesn't pass?

Program cuts, staff reductions, and larger class sizes would most likely occur, adversely impacting student outcomes and their ability to be career—, college—, and community—ready.

What about the capital referendum—what happens if that doesn't pass?

If the capital referendum isn't approved, some of the district's critical needs will remain unmet.

Can you explain the difference between an operational and a capital referendum?

An operational referendum asks voters to approve funds for the district's everyday operational costs, like facility maintenance, supplies, utilities, and salaries. A capital referendum is for one-time expenditures, like constructing or enhancing buildings.

What does it mean when a referendum is non-recurring?

A non-recurring referendum is a temporary increase in taxes. Because the requested referendum replaces an expiring referendum, there is no new tax impact for voters.

Will every School District of Janesville school benefit from the capital referendum?

Every school in Janesville will see improvements if the capital referendum passes.

While the School District of Janesville is a big source of pride, our district has both operational and facility needs that require the attention of our entire community. District leaders and the Board of Education believe the time has come to address these needs in a comprehensive manner that positions our schools and students for success now and in the years ahead.

On Tuesday, November 5, 2024, our community will vote on **TWO** proposed referendum questions:

A two-year, \$14.5 million non-recurring operational referendum to renew the measure voters approved in 2020.



A \$151.8 million capital referendum to address facility needs across our schools and move forward with Phase 1 of our longrange facilities plan.







OPERATIONAL REFERENDUM

The district's current \$14.5 million referendum expires in 2024-2025. The expiring **operational referendum** was approved by over 17,000 district voters in 2020. On November 5, voters will be asked whether to renew the \$14.5 million referendum for an additional two years, through 2026-2027.

A renewed operational referendum would allow SDJ to:



Maintain small class sizes at key grade levels



Continue investments in classroom technology and supporting infrastructure



Attract and retain staff



Address costs related to insurance, supplies, transportation, and utilities



Invest in curriculum resources



Avoid reductions that will hinder the district's mission



Because the operational referendum would be in the same amount as the previous measure, there would be **NO NEW ESTIMATED TAX IMPACT** for district residents.

CAPITAL ** REFERENDUM

On November 5, our community will also vote on a **CAPITAL REFERENDUM** question, not to exceed \$151.8 million, to address





the district's prioritized facility needs. The \$151.8 million proposal, detailed below, includes the most urgent Phase 1 facilities needs in the district's long-range facilities plan.



to repair or replace high-priority capital maintenance needs

\$11.1 million

to enhance safety and security

\$16.2 million to improve special education classrooms

The estimated property tax impact of the capital referendum would be \$81 per every \$100,000 of assessed fair market property value. A home valued at \$300,000 would see a property tax impact of \$243 per year (or \$20.25 per month), starting in the 2025-26 school year.



Online Conversations

Tips for Engaging on Social Media

Here's how you can make sure your online interactions are helpful and constructive:

1. Stick to Reliable Info and Credible Sources

Share content from trusted sources, accounts, and reputable news sites. Avoid sharing anything from sources you're unsure about—that way, we keep the message strong, credible, and clear.

2. Keep It Friendly

A friendly and constructive tone is best. If things start getting heated or confrontational, stepping back is okay. Staying respectful keeps the referendum's focus on track with the right people.

3. Use the Facts

Make sure your points are based on solid facts. You've got great resources in this toolkit (pages 11 and 12) to back you up, so use them to keep your messages accurate and supported.

4. Don't Feed the Trolls

If you come across negative or inflammatory comments, it's best not to engage. Responding can often make things worse and distract from what matters. Instead, put your energy into positive discussions.

5. Encourage Good Conversations

Start meaningful conversations by asking questions, sharing your own experiences, and respectfully inviting others to share their thoughts.

2. Attend and Speak at Local Meetings

Showing up at local school board meetings and speaking out at community meetings in favor of referendums can make a big impact.

3. Get Organized in Your Community

Forming a group or activating one you are part of, like a booster club, sports team, or school parent group, is a great way to rally support and coordinate efforts in Janesville. Present this toolkit and bring flyers to your next meeting!

Note: Avoid placing flyers in mailboxes, as it is legal to do so without proper postage. Per Sect. 508.3.1.3 of the Domestic Mail Manual (DMM).

4. Request a Presentation


Sometimes, a direct presentation is the best way to inform your community. You can present the toolkit on your own, or Forward Janesville's Keep Kids Learning Advocates can help!
